Team Spartan Continues Canadian Partner Tour in Ontario

Toronto, Ontario, July 15, 2013 –Team Spartan will continue its Canadian partner tour in support of its Fixed Wing Search and Rescue Replacement Program offering, the C-27J, in Toronto today. The cross-country tour, which began on July 10, has already made stops in Halifax and Montreal. The tour finishes in Vancouver on July 19.

The team, made up of Alenia Aermacchi, General Dynamics Canada, and DRS Technologies Canada Ltd. (TCL), recently signed a comprehensive teaming agreement to compete for the Royal Canadian Air Force's (RCAF) upcoming Fixed-Wing Search and Rescue Replacement Program. Together they will offer a market variant of the C-27J Spartan, Alenia Aermacchi's best-selling medium tactical military aircraft. The offering will leverage Alenia Aermacchi's international success with the C-27J, General Dynamics' system integration experience, and DRS' training expertise. The intention of the tour is to identify additional Canadian companies to add to the team.
